

CHAMPIONSHIP SWIMMING TROPHIES - CONDITIONS

**The Jubilee Cup. (Winner, Aggregate Points)
Presented by the late Miss ETHEL M. ROGERS, 1934**

**The Coronation Cup. (Runner-up, Aggregate Points)
Presented by the late Miss ETHEL M. ROGERS, 1937**

- 1 The Competition shall be open to Ladies Clubs or Sections affiliated to the S.C.W.P. & S.A.
- 2 Points shall be awarded for individual Ladies' and Girls' Swimming Championships, excluding Diving, as follows: 8,7,6,5,4,3,2,1, for the 8 fastest swimmers.
- 3 The Club obtaining the highest aggregate to hold the Jubilee Cup for one year and the Club obtaining the next highest aggregate to hold the Coronation Cup for one year.

**The St. James's Centenary Trophy. (Winner, Aggregate Points)
Presented by ST. JAMES'S S.C., 1979**

**The Shand Millenium Shield. (Runner-up, Aggregate Points)
Presented by Mrs PENNY SHAND, 2000**

1. The Competition shall be open to Mens Clubs or Sections affiliated to the S.C.W.P. & S.A
- 2 Points shall be awarded for individual Mens' and Boys' Swimming Championships, excluding Diving, as follows: 8,7,6,5,4,3,2,1, for the 8 fastest swimmers.
- 3 The Club obtaining the highest aggregate to hold the trophy for one year & the club obtaining the next highest aggregate points to hold the Millenium Shield for one year.

**The George Tinlin (Aggregate Points)
Age Group Trophy
Presented by CRANLEIGH A.S.C., 1983**

- 1 The Competition shall be open to all clubs affiliated to the S.C.W.P. & S.A.
- 2 Points shall be awarded for individual and team events in the Age Group Championships for ages 9 to 16 at the date specified in the Conditions Governing the Swimming Championships only, as follows: 8,7,6,5,4,3,2,1, for the 8 fastest swimmers.
- 3 The Club obtaining the highest aggregate to hold the trophy for one year. An all-female club, and an all-male club in the same locality may, with the express permission of the Executive, be considered as a 'joint' club for the Tinlin Trophy only.

CONDITIONS FOR ESTABLISHING COUNTY SWIMMING RECORDS

- 1 All records shall be made in still water by swimmers who must possess County qualification. Any movement of water due to the normal operation of the filtration system may be disregarded.
- 2 All records will be for open and junior classification. The open classification (men and women) shall have no age limits. A Junior Record (Boys and Girls) will only be recognised, if it is made by a swimmer who is under sixteen years of age on the date the record is made.
- 3 For all distances, the course shall not be less than 25 metres in length.
- 4 Records may be made in:
 - (a) A scratch competition held in public under A.S.A. laws provided that the Starter, Judges and Timekeepers are registered A.S.A. officials or
 - (b) By giving fourteen days' clear notice to the Championship Honorary Secretary: An unpaced individual race against time, the date and venue of which must have been arranged and advertised as such before the day of the event and for which the Starter, Judges and Timekeeper must have been appointed by the Championship Honorary Secretary and who are registered ASA officials.
- 5 The time shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate ASA Law of Racing. If hand held timers are used to determine the time, there must be at least two timekeepers as in 4 above. Notification shall be by means of an official results sheet, or by an entry card with the record of the time signed by the Referee, or other responsible official or officer.
- 6 Recognition of new records shall be established as follows:
 - (a) Details of records established in all events under shall be notified within twenty-eight days by the swimmer themselves or a representative on their behalf to the Championships Honorary Secretary.
 - (b) In the case of individual attempts under Rule 4(b), details shall be notified within fourteen days to the Honorary Championships Secretary by the Officials nominated.
- 7 A Certificate of Record will be issued for every successful attempt upon request.
